Early Days is an Australia-wide program of workshops for mothers, fathers and other family carers of children under the age of six who have an Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) or who are undergoing assessment.

The Secretariat of National Aboriginal and Islander Child Care (SNAICC) has consulted with the Early Days team to ensure the program includes and supports Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families of children with Autism.

An Early Days workshop has been developed for Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander families who have a child with Autism, or who think their child might have Autism and want to learn more about it.
