Early Days is a national program of free workshops for families of children six and under who have autism. The workshops are also for families who think their child might have autism and want to learn more about it.

Early Days has worked with the Secretariat of National Aboriginal and Islander Child Care (SNAICC) to create a workshop for mothers, fathers, aunties, uncles, grandparents and other family members from Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities.
